RSI is among the most common critical procedures performed for pediatric emergency patients and should be a high priority for quality assurance efforts.9-11First attempt success is used as a measure of the quality of the RSI process and the ease of intubation.2,3The failure of early attempts at intubation may deplete a patient's oxygen reserve, leading to physiologic deterioration of an already critically ill or injured child.

The makeup of the Pediatric Rapid Response Team should be based on the individual hospital's needs, culture, and available resources. The minimum requirements would be a critical care nurse with pediatric background or training and a pediatric trained respiratory therapist (4).
